30 October 2015 | Hong Kong — Following the success of the Master Class on Public Art series held early this year by Mr. Fumio Nanjo, the Art Education International Director of Hong Kong Art School as well as an internationally renowned Art Curator, the School is proud to announce that a new Master Class on New Dimension of Museum to be presented by Mr. Nanjo will be coming soon in December.

The **Master Class series hosted by Mr. Nanjo** is designed to particularly provide audience with a **new vision** on the **new role** and the **new management mode** of art, aiming to explore the controversial and the thought-provoking issues associating with references from Japan and all over the world. With his profound knowledge and experience in museum operation, Mr. Nanjo will look into the **New Dimension of Museum** in this new Master Class.

In the context of contemporary art, "museum" is taking on a new meaning, it may no longer be straightforwardly referring to a place which is dedicated to the "muses", or a venue which is set aside merely for the conservation of a collection of artifacts with artistic or cultural importance.

In the upcoming class, new possibilities and intriguing topics associated with museums will be explored, with particular reference to the following:

- O What is a collection?
- Is a collection truly necessary?
- o If there is already a permanent collection, should there be room for temporary exhibition?
- How can works/exhibits be presented?
- What are the challenges ahead for already established museums?
- O What are the new phenomena in the field?
- o How to perceive the museums in Naoshima, Teshima and Inujima?
- Looking also into the museums in Towada & Kanazawa, and the Mona in Tasmania etc.

This is definitely an insightful and sophisticated sharing which welcomes all, and is particularly suitable for policy makers, city planners, management bodies of museums, operators of art spaces, curators, architects, art collectors, art educators, art students, art practitioners, and any parties who are interested in the topics to attend.

Light Refreshments will be served during the class. While enjoying the aroma of freshly brewed coffee and tea, participants can also conduct friendly conversations with the Hosts.
