15 January 2016 | Hong Kong - In this coming April, Hong Kong Art School will be launching the Japan Art Tour with a newly designed itinerary, including a first-time exploration to the Tohoku Region of Japan. Since the Tohoku Region is well-known by its natural beauty and outdoor artworks, tour participants will be able to experience how the contemporary art and the splendid nature come together. The tour will also visit world-class museum in Tokyo, participants can attend a very exclusive art lecture given by a local art school in Tokyo and have their artistic horizons widened.

Led by experienced art lecturers of the School, whose professional views and knowledge about Japan Art and Culture are widely recognized, the Japan Art Tours conducted by Hong Kong Art School have always been well-received. Since 2011, the exclusive tours have been attracting hundreds of art lovers from a wide range of backgrounds and ages.



In this upcoming tour, participants will be visiting Aomori and Towada, the major cities in the Aomori Prefecture and the scenic sites therein, and experiencing the intriguing blend of Art and Nature. Alongside their artistic viewing of the masterpiece by Yoshitomo Nara and Yayoi Kusama, there is the embracement of the enchanting natural beauty of Aomori. The summer festival in Aomori, Nebuta Matsuri, is also an annual key event, participants in this tour may have the opportunity to visit the magnificently hand-crafted floating lanterns used in the festival. In the Tokyo City, in addition to exploring art museums with a behind-the-scene insight, participants will be able to take part in an Art Lecture that is exclusively conducted by a local contemporary art school which is specialized in innovative approaches in art teaching for the public in Tokyo.

Apart from its natural attributes, Aomori is famous for its summer festival, Aomori Nebuta Matsuri (青森ねぶた祭り).

The festival is with a history of 300 years, and "Nebuta" refers to the floating of warrior figures in the streets at the city center. In this upcoming trip, you may be able to visit the large-scaled handcrafted floating lanterns at the museum, Nebuta Warasse (ねぶたの家 ワ・ラッセ)!
